Sir

I purpose sending by the Mail this evening a parcel of drawings to Benson in which I have taken the liberty of sending some prints as specimens and prices of engraving, in consequence of the wish you expressed of being able to form some idea of the expence of a private plate of Sir A. Hoghton. I will thank you to desire Benson to return the prints to me with his monthly acct. as soon as you can conveniently spare them —

W. Ferguson (successor to Gillows) has furnished me with a sketch of an oval cistern for your sideboard, and the sizes & price of a set of oak dining tables, they are now finished and standing in his Shop for sale, and I think them very handsome —

The casing to the pier tables the oval frames and brackets have been repaired, and they are now

in a state to receive the preparation for gilding
if you approve of their being done, as they will take
some time, and when done, they may be secured against
harm.

In the same parcel, I have sent a
shadowed plan & elevation of the Conservatory
to a large scale, from which you will better
judge of the effect and fitness to the situation.

I have also return'd the general plan of the
grounds, and with it a traced copy, upon which I
have ventur'd to shew by sketches drawn with red,
such alterations as you may find upon reference
to the grounds practicable -
